Our Deputy Leader Mary Jones and her colleagues on the Policy committee are making progress on our policy review.

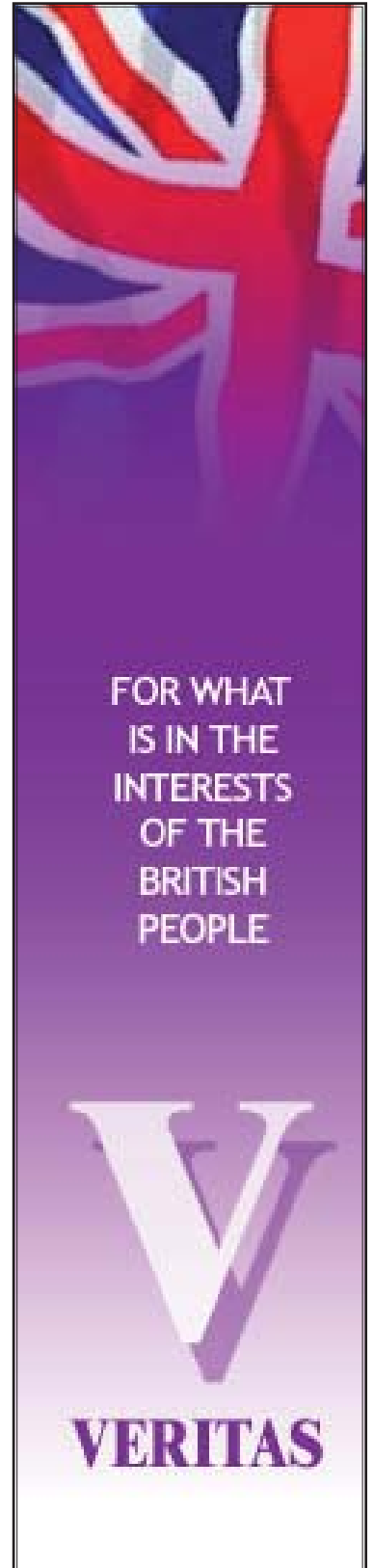
Our new Veritas web site is up and running and feedback from members and the public has been overwhelmingly positive.

As a consequence of my normal working arrangements I have occasion to travel some distance within the UK, meeting various people to discuss business requirements.



On one such visit recently I was asked what my view was regarding the current state of our manufacturing base. Somewhat cautious, as this was a new customer, I replied that much of what remained of our industry was in terminal decline.

My customer agreed. It then transpired that one of my competitors (UK based) had unfortunately gone out of business with the loss of over 100 jobs; a company I knew well, that had been in existence for nearly 100 years, and I had been in competition with for over 20 years of my working life.

The reason for its demise was an inability to compete with cheap foreign imports of its volume products. My customer's main concern was that this had resulted in the loss of the specialist capacity he required.

The company had tried to adapt to our global market during the last 10 years, even relocating to modern smaller factory units and changing its working practices and shift patterns.

Sadly this had not been sufficient and the directors had been ringing their main customers to advise of their demise. What interested me particularly was the remark that was passed to my customer, that what had

really killed them was the lack of government support to deal with the environmental issues that had been imposed by either the EU or Westminster.

The packaging regulations, the climate control levy, the additional costs on diesel as a 'dirty' fuel, the extra taxes, both direct and indirect and a significant raft of local regulations that they not only had to comply with, but also had to cover the costs of implementation and monitoring. His parting remark was "If we had only had to compete with the competition instead of our own government we could have survived."

I reflected, to myself, whilst this benefited me with a series of new enquiries, the continuing loss of wealth creating jobs, and transfer of people either into the public sector or onto the dole will soon be followed by an increase of the tax burden on me and a long term prospect of further pension problems for us all.

This was compounded by the announcement of the loss of the Peugeot factory at Ryton and the statement that since 1997 over 1.5 million jobs have been lost in manufacturing. In the same week the government issued statistics announcing that productivity from our manufacturing sector had increased by a modest 0.3%.

I was amazed by this so I did a bit of checking and found that the government had reset the 100% value for manufacturing output at 2002, which was seen as a dramatic decline in excess of 5% against 2001, the government now seems to boast that the manufacturing sector is less

than 14% of our GDP, great, such a shame that it seems 80% of our GDP is based on our people taking on extra debt!

Behind the statistics of the foreign criminals the Home Office saw fit to release lies something even more disturbing. That is the Labour's surreptitious policy of mass immigration.



In 1997 there was a net immigration into Britain of 26,000. According to the most recent figures available, for 2004, that figure has rocketed to a net figure of 342,000. In seven years Labour has attracted in 13 times more immigrants than when they came to power.

If we remove the outflow of emigrants from the 2004 figure, the number of people turning up on our shores to live here is a staggering 582,000. That is just the figure for a year, on top of this is to be added all the intervening years before it reached this figure. We must remember that this is the figure for those allowed in, it takes no account of those who enter illegally.

Can we even begin to comprehend the strain this is placing upon the NHS, schools, housing and ultimately the tax payer?

A fairer system or an abuse of our democratic principles?

Since the introduction of the present postal voting system by the Labour government in 2000 it has been

doggied with allegations of widespread fraud, vote stealing and intimidation of voters at Local, General and European elections.

Countless investigations, some of which have led to criminal charges being brought, have damaged the integrity of our once treasured electoral system and left Asian Muslim women victims of the cultural practice of gender intimidation.

campaigners for the Liberal Democrats and the Tories.

Police investigating allegations of election fraud in Bradford in 2005 arrested several people. Allegations were made against Jamshed Khan, 51, a Tory councillor in the city.

Concerns were raised when a newspaper found 13 people had applied for a postal vote at his Bradford home. A further 12 people were found to be registered to vote at a derelict house that he previously co-owned.

Of grave concern are the comments of Richard Mawrey, a senior judge presiding at a special election court in 2005 who accused the government of complacency and described the corruption in Birmingham's 2004 local elections as being "electoral fraud that would disgrace a banana republic".

After an investigation into allegations Richard Mawrey ordered new elections in Aston and Bordesley Green after upholding allegations of corrupt and illegal practices committed by Labour candidates at these elections.

Yet, despite attempts by the government and the Electoral Commission to tighten the system and increased presence of police on the look-out for problems, local elections have abounded with the same kinds of allegations as seen previously.

It is not just Labour politicians who are accused of rigging the vote.

Special Branch are investigating claims, by George Galloway leader of the Respect Party, into allegations of widespread postal vote fraud in Tower Hamlets and police are looking into similar allegations in six other parts of London including Harrow, Kensington and Chelsea, Meriton, Southwark, Hounslow and Barnet.

Mr Galloway said his party had uncovered what could be "one of the most serious examples of political corruption in modern British history".

Tony Backhouse (Bolton) raised concerns over the continuing problem with postal voting and the worrying behaviour of Labour candidates and their supporters at the local election count. These problems are widespread across the country.

Can it be coincidence that in my own area of Bradford the Labour Party bucked the national trend to win six seats, where their biggest successes came in the inner city wards which have a majority Asian Muslim population?

The real victims here — apart from the democratic process itself — are highly vulnerable Asian Muslim women from the sub-continent.

Continued intolerable political correctness around this question implies that it is not for outsiders to dispute how a community might chose to organise itself for the purpose of voting in elections. Consequently, the block vote appears to be an increasingly acceptable face of British politics.

Veritas asks when will the present government wake up?

Veritas asks when will the present government wake up to the fact that this country faces a huge and increasing problem with electoral fraud?

This undermines our democracy, undermines our reputation throughout the world as a beacon for democratic principles, allows the oppression of Asian Muslim women and panders to the negative cultural practices of a growing minority?

'Clean' Energy

As any Physicist will tell you, all energy can be converted but it cannot be destroyed. Therefore all energy is 'renewable' in some form or another. Veritas uses 'clean energy' to describe



the production of energy from resources that have little or no harmful by-products.

Wind farms are in the public eye. They are a conspicuous means of harnessing energy from a natural resource. This and other means of harnessing energy from tidal power, wave power, and hydropower, are termed intrusive methods. They have an environmental cost which defeats their presence.

Wind turbines cause significant mortality on birds and bats. Tidal turbines and large scale wave harnessing systems are a threat to marine wildlife. They also hinder human users of the sea such as fishermen. Hydropower, with its dams, floods land and disrupts or destroys river ecosystems. Veritas considers the disturbance to or direct loss of life of other living animals and the damage caused to ecosystems to be too high a cost for saving ourselves. More so when other methods of harnessing energy are more environmentally friendly, and efficient.

These are termed, non-intrusive methods. The main techniques include the use of hydrogen-based fuel cells, solar cells, and biofuels.

enough solar panels can be applied to a home to produce all the electricity one needs.

The application of hydrogen-based fuel cells is extensive. Amongst other applications, fuel cells can replace the central heating boiler, the internal combustion engine, and replace current fossil-fuel and gas-fired power stations. The main source of hydrogen is from the splitting of water (H₂O), which requires energy. Elec-

trolsers are now approaching 90% efficiency and, supplied with electricity produced by solar cells, can be an effective and logistically sound means of clean production. Current research is looking into combining these two into a single unit to maximise efficiency. Unlike wind farms, hydrogen has the advantage of being an energy carrier, it can be moved from one site to another just as fossil fuels can be.

The use of solar cells is well known but despite their low usage they are the most easily accessible and cleanest of all energy harnessers. They have the disadvantage of not working at night. This can be a problem for those living further north with longer winter nights. There is great room for improvement in the efficiency of solar cells presently around 15%. This is efficient enough for two moderate sized solar panels to cover the winter heating costs of a moderate sized home. Research cells are now at 30%, similar to the efficiency of large power generating plants. Recent advances in nano-technology suggest figures will get higher. With the help of storage cells, enough solar panels can be applied to a home to produce all the electricity one needs. At present, the government will pay 50% of the cost of solar panels. Better funding into R&D and aggressive marketing should reduce this cost.

Biofuels (wood, gas from manure and other organic waste, 'liquid fuel' from oil seed crops) have been used since man discovered fire. It is likely to be local in its production and application, supplying farms, individuals, and perhaps local communities living in or close to the countryside. In total it could account for a substantial amount of energy use; worldwide it stands at roughly 15%.

The burning of wood and other similar material produces less carbon dioxide (CO₂) than can be absorbed by plants. It produces virtually no sulphur dioxide (SO₂) while nitrous oxide (NO₂) emissions are low. Wood is a more natural means of energy for those people who would not be able to afford more expensive means of producing clean energy.

The burning of biogas, effectively methane (CH₄), produced from manure, sewage farms, and landfill sites means taking out a very harmful greenhouse gas (more harmful than CO₂). CH₄ accounts for about 15% of the greenhouse gases in the atmosphere, although much of it is of natural occurrence. The CO₂ and NO₂ emissions are lower than that

produced by wood.

Biodiesel can be produced from oil seed crops and waste cooking oil. The use of pure biodiesel in diesel engines reduces emissions of soot by 40% and SO₂ to zero. A large amount of land is required to grow any 'fuel crop' which is environmentally unfriendly. Also, greenhouse gases (e.g., NO₂ from nitrogen fertilisers) created by large scale farming of 'fuel crops' would not be insubstantial. Therefore, it can only have a low scale and local use where land is already being farmed. Such a fuel should be tax free, including that mixed with diesel. Placing tax on aviation fuel, is long overdue and would offset any loss in tax revenue.

This is a brief summary of the main non-intrusive methods of clean viable energy production and a few of its applications, some of them national, many of them local. Efficient use of energy is as important as its production and this starts at home. A home can be made more than energy self-sufficient with the use of hydrogen fuel cells, small wind harnessing methods, solar panels, water collection containers, and waste recycling schemes.

A home can be made more than energy self-sufficient

Self-sufficiency brings greater awareness to the owner/occupier and should bring a responsibility in the use and conservation of the energy they produce. New homes need to be designed and built with energy self-sufficiency in mind.

In 2003, the US president pledged over \$1 billion towards hydrogen R&D over five years. Our government pledged only £6 million to its own research. Britain must do a lot more; we have no choice. Veritas will continue to monitor international R&D in all areas of non-intrusive clean energy production. It will, with the help of business, science, and the public, nationally and internationally, ensure an energy policy that will bring self-sufficiency, economic stability, and a healthier environment to our country.

Dear Editor,

During my local election campaign in Bolton I stumbled across information which I had been actively seeking for the last three years.

It is, as I suspected, the case that Bolton council has been prepared to sell publicly owned land to Muslim groups for far less than an achievable market price.

This discovery could be considered as being born from irony, because I became aware of the information through the campaign literature of one of my political opponents.

Sufrana Bashir-Ismail the Labour candidate and subsequently elected councillor for Crompton ward circulated amongst the Muslim community an election flyer describing how the Labour Party had served the requirements of Muslims in Bolton.

She also pointed out that a parcel of land owned by BMBC was being sold to a Muslim group for £40,000.

The land in question is a green field site, less than one mile from the town centre, and is approximately 1300 square yards in size: it is, even to a layman obviously worth far more than £40,000.

The public's reaction to the disposal of land in this way is likely to be hostile, and Labour's distribution of campaign leaflets pertaining only to Muslim voters will do nothing to dispel that hostility.

This tactic of conveniently stepping away from secular politics is something which all three of the old parties are prepared to do, if they see an opportunity to gain a political advantage via religious demographics. It is I believe a very unfair and irresponsible tactic.

Profile - Deputy Leader

Mary Elizabeth Jones (42) was born in Stourbridge, in the middle of the worst winter on record (1963). Born into a working class family, Mary learned that if you wanted something you had to work for it – nothing was ‘free’.

Mary was often referred to as “a slow starter” at school, and that “She will get there eventually”. If she had a passion for something, she gave it 110%, if she had no interest, 0%.

She was a founder member of Stourbridge Water Safety Society. At 16, she was one of the youngest people in Europe to attain the ‘Qualified Swimming & Life Saving Teacher’ qualification and recognised by the Swimming Teachers Association at their Annual Conference in 1979 – one of her proudest days.

Whilst growing up, her mother was studying to be a nurse and Mary was very interested in these studies and became very interested in medicine herself. 8 ‘O’ levels enabled her to work in a city hospital in the Pathology Laboratory, where she specialised in Haematology. Continuing her work and studies within this field, Mary was still teaching swimming and started to teach a local group of mentally handicapped people which spurred her on to a change of career.- becoming a Student Nurse for the Mentally Handicapped (RNMS).

1989 saw a change in direction when, with her husband, they decided to buy a hotel in Blackpool. Mary then studied for her HNC Business Studies, (Personnel Management) and attained a NEBSS certificate for Supervisory Studies. In 1998, returning to her home town of Stourbridge she became involved in people-oriented businesses, and currently runs her own Marketing Company working in the finance arena.

Since becoming eligible to vote, she has never had any allegiance to political parties, always believing Britain was “being sold down the river”. During the run-up to the 2005 General Election, she used the Internet to research alternative political parties. Mary said *“It was like a light being switched on when I first read the Veritas Manifesto. At last, people who felt the same as I did, I wanted to be part of it and paid my membership fee straight away.”* Mary knew that there were thousands of other people who felt the same, but needed to all come together under one umbrella in order to have their voices heard.

Mary became a more active member and stood for election to the NEC in 2005. She is now the Party Spokesperson for Foreign Affairs and Deputy Party Leader. *“I believe that Veritas is the only viable alternative to the existing main political parties and it is now my duty to support our elected leader, Patrick Eston, the Party Spokespeople, the NEC members and the Party members in our fight.
